B.F.T.A. CHAMPIONSHIP SHOOT RULES 2006

Your entry implies acceptance of these rules...

1. The BFTA will make sure that the Stats Office is organised, as well as providing all scorecards and paperwork.
2. Entries are limited to 15 shooters from each region. Each region is required to provide a list of nominated shooters by 10am on the day of the shoot.
3. The BFTA will provide a course of fire consisting of 40 targets in lanes of 2 according to current BFTA Shoot Rules. This course is to be ready for a 10am start.
4. A Jury of 3 BFTA Officers, named by the Chairman, will settle any dispute.
5. All shooters must be booked in by 11am unless they have made prior arrangement with the BFTA Competition Secretary.
6. The BFTA recommended marshalling system will be used.
7. Top Score on the day becomes BFTA Champion, with awards to 10th place.
8. Tied scores will be settled by shoot-offs. If scores are still tied, targets can be moved and/or sudden death may be applied at the discretion of the Shoot Jury.
9. No member of the Shoot Jury may be involved in a decision where he or she is involved as a shooter.

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10. BFTA MAIN SHOOT RULES, will apply.

11. All guns used in the competition will be chronographed, please see MAIN SHOOT RULES 2006. 3) EQUIPMENT TESTING. for
more details.
